Behave or lose seat

Police today warned league fans to be on their best behaviour at Friday night's Bulldogs v Eels blockbuster or risk being thrown out of the ground.

Assistant commissioner Denis Clifford said police would be out in force to ensure the safety of the 70,000-plus fans expected at ANZ Stadium.

"Fans travelling by public transport to Sydney Olympic Park can also expect a heavy police presence," he said.

Friday night's attendance is already a non-grand final record, with 63,500 tickets sold by 10am today - more than the 57,973 crowd at the 1963 Parramatta v St George final.

The NRL today said it expected more than 70,000 people to attend the preliminary final.

Almost all A-Reserve tickets

had been sold by this morning, with only a handful of single seats still available in the three Alcohol Free bays and only limited tickets in Eels and Bulldogs supporter bays.

Transport Minister David Campbell reminded fans they could travel to and from the game for free on public transport with their match tickets.

CityRail said dedicated services stopping only at Central, Redfern, Strathfield and Olympic Park would operate every 15 minutes from 4.50pm.

The Olympic Park Sprint would operate from Lidcombe station every 10 minutes until midnight.

Extra services will run direct to Central every 15 minutes until 12.45am along with four extra Bankstown line services and one additional South line service.
